BIRDS has been working with the vulnerable target group families especially, landless, Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (SC/STs), small and marginal farmers, women on socio economic issues and development of rural poor through diversified developmental activities.

BIRDS have implemented many outstanding projects of sponsored by Government of India, Government of Karnataka and Zilla Panchayats. Both Indian and Foreign donor agencies have been supporting our activities over the years. So far, we have successfully implemented Community Organization and Awareness Program supported by OXFAM, Secundrabad, and IGSSS, New Delhi, Mother & Child and Health Care Project supported by MISEREOR, Germany, Integrated Rural Water Supply and Sanitation Program assisted by Netherland and Karnataka Watershed Development Programme through various schemes by Government of Karnataka.

1.1 Rehabilitation & Resettlement: BIRDS have also worked on community development in 14 Rehabilitation and Resettlement (R & R) displaced villages of Hungund Taluka, Bagalkot District, by Narayananpur Dam during 1992 to 2000. The project was supported by OXFAM India Trust, Secundarabad. The cost of the Project was Rs.22,95,191. OXFAM supported the R& R program till March 2000, however, BIRDS continued work for subsequent two years (2000-2002) with the funds left out of OXFAM Grant. BIRDS has covered six components of the issues of Projected Affected Families (PAP's) under the above assignment, namely (i) Education to school drop outs, *Devdasis* and Anganwadi children (ii) Formation of Village Development Committees (VDCs) through SHGs and Mahila Mandal for promotion of savings, thrift and credit for income generating activities on one hand and effective implementation of Government Programs on the other (iii) Mobilizing Government resources, particularly for improving agriculture yield, and animal husbandry as an additional activity for sustainability. (iv) Enhancement of income generation through upgradation of skills, for which various skills

development trainings were organized. (v) Motivation for construction of community assets, like tanks, community hall, temples, milk collection booths, schools, Anganwadi and Panchayat buildings etc.,

Later, during 2000-2005, BIRDS has worked on R & R issues in 33 villages of Bilagi Taluka, Bijapur District, displaced by Almatti Dam with the support from MISEREOR, Germany. Similarly, for another 21 villages BIRDS has worked with the support from Camand Area Development Authority, (CADA), Government of Karnataka during 2002-03. CAPART, Southern Regional Office, Dharwad, Karnataka Government supported for one year during 2003-04 to follow up and strengthen PAPs in 10 villages under its scheme of Organizing Beneficiaries (OB).

1.2 Community Participation in Rural Drinking and Sanitation Program: BIRDS have facilitated community participation in Rural Drinking water and Sanitation programme in 72 villages as part of program of Zilla Panchayats of Bijapur and Bagalkot district assisted Netherlands during 1995-96 under PVOH-II Scheme. US Aid has supported through Government of India, Ministry of Health and Family Welfare implemented MCH & FW (Mother and Child Health and Family Welfare) project at 33 villages of Hungund taluk, Bagalkot district during 1995-96 and 1996-97. Worked as Nodal NGO in Saint John Medical College Community Health Center Bangalore and also organized the Cataract & Eye Operation Camp in Karadi, Kudalasangam & Hungund PHC. Totally 350 people get eye operation. During 1995-1996, 1996-1997.

1.3 RCH Project (Reproductive Child Health): implemented with support of SOSVA-Karnataka Chapter, Bangalore at one PHC area of Hungund taluk and one PHC area of Bilagi taluk, during 1999-2001. Successfully implemented Mother & Child Health Project of Bilagi Taluk Bagalkot. Supported by MISEREOR Germany during 2001-2004.

The Organization serving as a **Mother NGO** since 2002 in Bagalkot district by coordinating Reproductive Child Health (RCH) sponsored by Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, New Delhi. Conducted Induction Training, completed Baseline Survey & Tabulation with 4 FNGOs.

1.4 IEC Programme on Safe Abortion: Campaigns were conducted in all 6 Taluks of Bagalkot district & three taluks of Gadag district Viz. Mundaragi, and Shirahatti during 2004-2005 & 2005-06 with support of Path Finder, New Delhi.

1.5 ASHA Training (Accredited Social Health Activist) Training Project): Successfully implemented training for 599 ASHA's belonging to Hungund, Badami & Bagalkot taluk of Bagalkot district in association with Narayana Hrudayalaya, Bangalore. The program is part of National Rural Health Mission, Government of India, New Delhi.

- a. Accommodated 90 trainees and 10 staff in a batch for residential training.
- b. Providing accommodation, food and recreation facilities during training.
- c. Provide space for training.
- d. Accommodate staff and volunteers of Narayana Hrudayalaya, Bangalore.
- e. Created a congenial atmosphere of learning.

The purposes of the above said program is for mobilizing the community and facilitate them in accessing health and health related services at the Anganawadi/ Sub-center/ PHCs. It aimed at providing health services, such as immunization, Ante Natal Check-up (ANC), Post Natal Check-up, supplementary nutrition, sanitation and other health related services. Each

ASHA is expected to serve 1000 population, the main aim of the ambitious project is to reduce death rate of mother & child. Totally 584 ASHA's get trained from the BIRDS training center.

1.6 Peoples Participatory Integrated Watershed Project: BIRDS have been worked jointly with Karnataka Watershed Department Agency, Government of Karnataka, and successfully implemented Peoples Participatory Integrated Watershed Project in the following areas of Karanataka.

1. KAWAD Doddahalla sub watershed- Inchegeri Village, Indi Taluk of Bijapur District.
2. Sujal Yarnal Sub Watershed Project 2- Navalagund Taluk, Dharwad District
3. Devaragudihal Sub watershed 3- Hubli Taluk of Dharwad District

1.7 Organic Farming Project: BIRDS have implemented **Organic Farming Project** in Rantur Devihal villages of Shirahatti Taluka Gadag District & Basapur & Amargol village of Navalagund Taluka Dharwad District with the support of Agriculture Department.

Implemented the ASHA KIRAN Residential School in Ghattiganur village of Bagalkot District with the support of Sarva Shikshana Abhiyan, Bagalkot.

1.8 Flood Relief and Response Programme: BIRDS participated in Flood Relief and Response Programme with the support of OXFAM India & provided immediate relief to flood affected people of Bagalkot district. We constructed the 20 Temporary Latrines, & 10 bathing cubicals in Flood affected area of Hungund Taluk with the support of OXFAM India. To sensitize the children about personal hygiene, demonstration and awareness session was conducted & the drawing and painting competition, essay or poem writing and Quizzing competition. Three prizes were given for each category. From October to December 2009.

1.9 ICRISAT Model Watershed Project: BIRDS implementing ICRISAT Model Watershed Project in Dharwad Taluk, Dharwad District with the support of ICRISAT Patancheru.

BIRDS Implementing Truckers Intervention project in Hubli TSL of Dharwad District with support of KSAPS & NACO. To help the people in the Transport Industry with all means, either it is business, legal matters and health and updating the knowledge in transport field and to create healthy trade condition. To help the people who are connected directly or indirectly like drivers Helpers, Hamalies, Cleaners and Laborers in imparting knowledge on prevention of the diseases, which are preventing in the society with the main aim of "prevention is better than Cure" In this connection BIRDS facilitating the project and providing waiting room for drivers, linking to health facilities and hospitals. BIRDS conducted regular workshops, conferences, seminar to raise awareness, and health camps for drivers and hamalies with respect to HIV/AIDS.

1.10 Karnataka State Highways Improvement Project-II, Phase-I: Implementing Karnataka State Highways Improvement Project-II, Phase-I in Dharwad, Haveri, Gulbarga, Belgaum, Raichur, districts with the support of KSHIP & World Bank. The objective of the project is to assist the PWD to implement the RAP and to mitigate the adverse effects of the project. The **NGO** will remain responsible for the development of a comprehensive livelihood system to facilitate the project affected persons (PAPs) to take advantages of the options available as per the RAP.

Completed joint verification of the project affected persons with local Social Development Resettlement Cell (SDRC) and updated the database on the eligible PAPs and project-affected families (PAFs). Convention Meeting held with all the PAPs, PAF,s of all the Linkages. Formed District level Grievance Committee make PAP,s aware of the grievance mechanism set out in the RAP and assist PAP,s who have grievances to pursue a suitable remedy. Micro Plan preparation is under progress.

1.11 Communicating Health Advocacy in NRHM for Grass Roots Empowerment” (CHANGE) Project: Implementing the “Communicating Health Advocacy in NRHM for Grass Roots Empowerment” (CHANGE) Project in Hungund Taluk with the Support of CMC Vellore. Participatory Need Assessment (PNA) is under progress. The objective of the project is to understand the knowledge of NRHM among the Community, to identify the knowledge of service providers and to identify communication of community and the PRI.
